PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 2010

Dear Friends in Christ:

This past year ends with mixed feelings for me. I saw many good things, but we also experienced some difficult times as well. In the midst of all of what has happened this past year, we continue to be blessed by God. We have been given this community, these buildings, and a call to be the people of God here and now in this place. What we will do in the future depends on what you, the people of Living Springs Lutheran Church, decide to support and live into as the followers of Jesus Christ.

The year 2010 was another year that we had to deal with painful economic matters that shook many families and people, in the congregation and in the community. Our own congregations' income was down. We cut back on staff and made some financial cuts that will be implemented in 2011. We also experienced a loss in membership as a response to the ELCA adoption of the sexuality statement in August 2009.

Despite all of this, we welcomed 58 new members into the community of Living Springs. People are still looking for a church home, and many of them have found their way to Living Springs.

I wish to give a special thanks to the staff of Living Springs. They are a dedicated and hardworking group of people. We welcomed Lexanne Graves this year as our part-time director of Faith Formation; she has added new energy and excitement to the Living Springs ministry. Nickie Riley has provided tremendous leadership to our choirs, played the organ, and directed our music ministry. Shawn Dunn has been wonderful as she has kept the office in order, and ministry information, which is no easy task with such a vast number of programs and activities here at Living Spring. Sherry Forsgren has kept our finances running smoothly in the midst of difficult times. And we give thanks for the musical gifts of Laura Turnmire as she has directed our bell choirs. Finally, we give thanks for Tammy Mancuso and our preschool staff who provide a wonderful community outreach and a safe and nurturing place for the children we serve. These are the people who help to facilitate a great deal of the ministry. Thank you!

The Church Council has done a faithful and responsible job with fewer resources this past year. Special thanks go to those who will be leaving council this year, Brenda Grohman, Jennifer Wiggins, Pete McManus and Annmarie McManus. And a special thank you to Steve Cronin who has served as treasurer for four years.

Thank you to our ministry team leaders and all those who serve in any ministry at Living Springs. You make ministry come alive. You are truly the hands and feet of Jesus as you make Christ known here at Living Springs and far beyond.

I would like to summarize some of the highlights and challenges that this year has presented. The year 2010 saw Living Springs to continue to be a child friendly parish. The children and youth are as much a part of the congregation as anyone else and their enthusiasm is a sign of good things to come. We have welcomed many newcomers, and people who visit here frequently, comment on how warm and friendly Living Springs is when they visit.

Some of the special things we have undertaken in 2010 point to a congregation concerned about reaching out to others. We have served with Adams NE AME church to supply back packs to Long Leaf Middle School and other schools in the community. We hope that this will build friendships over the coming years.

We resettled the Naji family from Iraq. This was an amazing effort that took time, talents and a financial commitment from the congregation. A special thank you to Pat Dickerson who coordinated this effort. This family is settled in Columbia and doing well.

Our stewardship ministry team stepped up to the plate and wrote their own program this year entitled Loaves and Fishes. As a result, we had the best response in pledge cards in years.

The most challenging piece of 2010 was our financial concerns. As a result this congregation made some hard choices concerning staffing and benevolence. I give thanks that Living Springs continues to give the give 10% of our expected income to the ministry of the wider church. This is a sign that we value the ministries of our synod and the ELCA including: Campus ministry, Newberry College, the Lutheran Seminary, World Hunger, Lutheran Family Services, etc.

The good news is that we have a God who loves us, a tradition of welcoming and sharing, and the ability to do whatever we put our minds and hearts to in the years to come.

In closing, thank you for what you have done. I continue to be blessed to be your pastor. May God guide us, may Jesus lead us and may the Holy Spirit give us the tools and the will as we move ahead.

TREASURER'S ANNUAL REPORT 2010

The following pages contain information on the financial resources of the congregation for the period January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2010.

The balance sheet comparison report compares our financial position at the end of 2009 with that of 2010. Assets decreased by \$9,651 and liabilities decreased by \$81,012, thereby increasing equity by \$71,361. The congregation's total assets are \$1,458,653 with \$945,766 in liabilities.

The balance sheet reflects \$40,000 of additional payments to reduce our mortgage as a result of our Forward in Faith Capital Campaign.

The expenditures report summarizes the income and expenditures that were recorded as compared to the 2010 Spending Plan. The approved spending plan for 2010 was \$511,963. Total expenditures amounted to \$462,934, or 90% of the total spending plan. Total income was \$460,016, thereby resulting in a net loss of Ordinary Income of \$2,918. Other Income/Expense totaled -\$7,151, resulting in a Net Loss of \$10,070.

Detailed copies of Living Springs' financial records are available upon request at the Church office.

Finally, I would like to extend special thanks to Sherry Forsgren, our Bookkeeper, and to Dan Camp, the chair of the Finance Ministry team, for their invaluable contributions in keeping our financial house in order.

CAPITAL FUNDS CAMPAIGN ANNUAL REPORT 2010

Through the end of December, we have collected \$137,606 for the Forward in Faith Capital Campaign. A total of \$32,463 has been used to replace the roof, paint the steeple, and repair air conditioners. We have also made additional payments of \$40,000 toward reducing the mortgage. The current balance in this account is \$65,183. It will be necessary for us to utilize some of these funds in the very near future to replace the HVAC units in the sanctuary.

Early in the campaign the church council made decisions related to how this money would be utilized. We have continued to follow this plan, funding only the priorities that were set by the leaders in the congregation.

Thanks to everyone who has continued to honor the commitments made during the campaign.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION MINISTRY ANNUAL REPORT 2010

“According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building on it. Each builder must choose with care how to build on it. For no one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Jesus Christ.”

The following is an overview of the programs and events within the Christian Education Ministry at Living Springs Lutheran Church that took place during the year 2010.

✝ *Confirmation Ministry*

The core of **Confirmation Education** is a two and a quarter year program, beginning in the 7th grade, and taught every Sunday from September through May from 9:30 am until 10:30 am in the Katie Room on the main level of the administration building. The Augsburg Fortress curriculum, *Here We Stand*, provides core Lutheran doctrine and principles as well as in-depth studies of the Old and New Testaments, Holy Baptism, Holy Communion, the Ten Commandments, the Lord’s Prayer, and the Apostle’s Creed. Experiences in music, movies, science, and other activities deepen the learning and incorporate life application lessons for today’s youth. The students also attend a six-week study on discerning their spiritual gifts. This class is taught by Jan Berger. In addition, students are required to attend one "off-campus" retreat during the spring and attend "Campfirmation at Lutherock" at least one time during their confirmation studies.

- Eleven students attended the **Faith Alive Retreat at Lutheridge** April 30 - May 2. Jan Berger "camped" with them and enjoyed spending time with other adult confirmation teachers. Jan said, “We had a wonderful time! The group studied Martin Luther and the Reformation and how we can be "evangelical" in our call to serve.” Ed Brennan and Craig Stoxen provided transportation for the group.
- **Campfirmation** week was held June 20-26 at Lutherock. Teaching was focused on the life and travels of the Apostle Paul. The students enjoyed great food, fellowship, hiking, high ropes courses, a zip line, mountain water slides and more! We give thanks to God for: Allie Olsen, Nick Stoxen, Patrick Lay, Nowell Ramsey, Andrew Levitt, Sam Drafts, and Jackson Evans.
- **Confirmation Orientation** was held on August 30. Sixteen Confirmation students were enrolled for study in 2010.
- Nine youth were confirmed during the **Affirmation of Baptism** service on Reformation Sunday, October 24, 2010. We give thanks to God for Madeline Arnold, Meredith McKenzie, Nowell Ramsey, Faith Rutz, Hannah Staudt, Nicholas Stoxen, Audrey Turnmire, Jackson Evans, Nash Via, and all of their families. Each confirmand wore a special stole they designed depicting their spiritual gifts and how they will use them. We also want to recognize Sarah Hurlbert, daughter of Jeanne and Marshall Hurlbert, who participated in the

program, but will be confirmed in the Catholic Church. We are also especially thankful to Jan Berger for all her work with the Confirmation Ministry!

Expenses for the Confirmation Ministry for the year were approximately \$1600 for program costs (*Here We Stand* license, Confirmation Dinner, Catechism books, stoles and supplies, and the Spring Retreat) and \$2400 for Campfirmation. Most of these expenses were paid by donations to this ministry and also by parents who paid for their child's participation in the Faith Alive Retreat. We give thanks to God for all the students, their families, and congregational members who support this valuable ministry. Many thanks for our Confirmation leaders: Jan Berger (Confirmation Director), Mike Davidson, Bob and Laura Turnmire, Pastor Christine Stoxen, and Lexanne Graves. We also appreciated having Alicia Koon, one of our seminarian students, teach for two months in November and December.

✝ ***Sunday School Program***

All God's children are called to a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ through lifelong learning.

We have more than 140 children and youth at Living Springs; 77 are enrolled in the Sunday School Program! Here are some highlights from the past year:

✝ **A Sunday School Year End Celebration and Sunday School Teacher Appreciation** were held on Sunday, May 16 from 9:30am-10:30am in the Sanctuary. There were no children or youth Sunday school classes on this day. Children in grades K-6, and the Confirmation and High School Youth were present. All celebrated! ✝ All offerings from children, youth and adult Sunday school classes go to **Heifer International**, which provides long-term solutions for ending world hunger. We collected \$1500 and were able to purchase two heifers and two water buffalos. Thank you for your continued support of Heifer International!

✝ **Sunday School Rally Day Kickoff** was held on Sunday, August 22 and was coordinated by Lexanne Graves. Sixty-six people attended this fun family event.

✝ **Sunday School Classes** for all ages resumed on August 29 with 102 people in attendance. Children's songs began at 9:15am on the lower level. Children ages 2-grade 6 met in classrooms on the lower level of the Administration Building. Children ages 2-3 through Grade 6 were taught lessons from the *Spark* curriculum. Confirmation students met in the Katie Room on the main level of the Administration Building and were taught lessons from the *Here We Stand*

confirmation curriculum by Jan and Rocky Berger. High School Youth met in the Luther Room on the main level of the Administration Building and were taught by Adam Woodruff. The Large Group Study for adults met in the Fellowship Hall. A new Sunday school class for marriage couples entitled *Marriage L.I.G.H.T.* was started and taught by Amy Sensabaugh. An additional Adult Bible Study Class began in November 2010 taught by Pastor Chris on the Gospel of Matthew.

- ✝ An **Intergenerational Sunday School** event was held on Reformation Sunday, October 31, 2010, where we gathered for fun and fellowship and learned about Martin Luther.

FACILITIES ANNUAL REPORT 2010

The facilities team has been operating within an extremely tight budget and has been working on simple upkeep of the building. Most of the work that has been completed during the year has been limited to regular maintenance of the building including but not limited to, bulb replacement, touch up paint, minor repair of odds and ends in the building, and grounds maintenance.

Currently, the facilities team has been working with Spring Valley heat and air, assisting in the removal and replacement of (4) hvac units in the sanctuary. The heating system has proved to be unreliable this winter, and during trouble shooting procedures it was discovered there was a bad ac unit on the exterior of the building that was in need of replacement. Pending completion of the hvac install, facilities will restore the Christmas decorations. The process of clearing out and cleaning the storage shed has been started and will allow all of the facilities equipment and parts and materials to be relocated out of the interior closet and into the shed. And should serve as a work and repair area for the facilities crew and allow for some storage of larger items (i.e. mower and building maintenance related products). Once the shed has been completed, we will be able to re configure the internal closet for food storage and materials for the back pack project.

Facilities is also in the process of starting to assemble “shovel” ready projects that will be maintained in the admin building and available to distribute to anyone who has time and or the skills to complete. We envision a “pick a project type display”. Facilities is currently monitoring a minor water leak in the preschool building. This is a result of water coming in around the electrical trunk line about the ceiling into one of the classrooms. We are currently devising a plan of action and repair options. Facilities has also been approached by the preschool to assist in the planning and construction of a “garden” for the preschool.

LIVING SPRINGS LUTHERAN MEN IN MISSION ANNUAL REPORT 2010

“Service to Christ through Mission support”

PRIMARY MISSION: to strengthen the spiritual development and witness of men and to provide financial and other support to mission congregations in the South Carolina Synod.

MEMBERSHIP: all men who attend Living Springs Lutheran Church are members of our organization. We promote the involvement and participation of all males, young and even not so young. All are welcomed to participate.

OUR PURPOSE: God’s grace, to nurture the men of Living Springs in the Word of God so as to grow in faith, hope and love, to see daily life as the primary setting for the exercise of their Christian faith, and to use the gifts God has given us to help one another.

WHAT WE DO: in addition to raising funds to support scholarships within our own congregation, as well as other projects that may present themselves, we contribute to the following South Carolina Men in Mission funds:

The Gift Fund, which provides direct gifts to mission congregations to use in any manner the pastor/developer and congregational council deems appropriate. The fund is depleted annually and rebuilt the following year.

The Loan Fund, which was started in 1925 and provides interest-free loans to mission congregations up to \$350,000 for up to 20 years for capital improvements or debt reduction. Loans may be made to non-mission churches or ministries of the SC Synod as “Special Cases” with a \$150,000 maximum for a 10 year period. The fund has assets of over \$2.5 million with approximately \$1 million on loan to congregations/institutions.

The New Mission Start Program was established to fund pastors/developers of new mission churches during the early years of the church’s development. Currently the program is supporting five new mission churches in South Carolina.

The Committee of 100 was formed in 1976 to raise additional money for the Loan Fund. The intent was to have 100 men contribute \$100 each. Today the goal is to have 1,200 men and women of the church to donate \$100 or more each year.

Highlights for this year included the following activities:

- Held monthly meetings, usually scheduled on the 3rd Monday of the month with a variety of activities to include “Boys Night Out”
- Prepared and served Easter morning breakfast for the congregation. The proceeds from the event went to the Carl Lowman Scholarship Fund, supporting young men pursuing a college education.
- Helped raise funds for the youth to go to the National Youth Gathering by cooking and preparing BBQ lunches.
- Attended the State and several Midlands Conference meetings, as well as hosted the fall meeting at the fellowship hall.
- Held annual Shannon Long Memorial Fund golf tournament, banquet and auction in which 50 golfers and 80 diners helped raise over \$4500.
- Conducted church services on Lutheran Men’s Sunday in September/
- Held another BBQ fundraiser in October (now an annual event) and raised \$735 to support our yearly SC Lutheran Men in Mission apportionment.
- Met our apportionment for the year.
- Wrapped up the year with our annual Christmas get together by electing new officers during our December meeting. Serving in 2010 will be President, Adam Woodruff; Vice President, Bob Turnmire; Secretary, Mike Wyka; Treasurer; Herb Brantley; and Committee of 100 Chair; Irvin LeGrand.

LIFEPOINT COUNSELING CENTER THERAPIST'S ANNUAL REPORT

This year has been a very rewarding and successful year of meeting critical needs in the lives of individuals, couples, and families. Mark Tidsworth, Director reports a total of 762 sessions of counseling in 2009 and 1249 sessions in 2010. At our Living Springs office we offered 41 sessions in 2009 and 164 sessions in 2010. As you can see, we are growing and seeing more and more clients from our church, community and greater Columbia area.

Dr. Don Hillyard, our Northeast therapist seeing clients at our church library, provided pastoral psychotherapy for 23 individuals, 7 couples, and 3 families with problems with children and/or youth. Many of the individuals were provided EMDR counseling. Most of the couples experienced the Prepare-Enrich marriage assessment inventories. Parents of children and adolescents were provided Adlerian parenting materials. Every client was acquainted with Rational-Emotive-Behavioral Therapy and Christian resources. Dr. Hillyard says, "it has truly been a privilege and a healing experience to be able to provide good clinical therapy and Christian love".

Our projections for 2011 see continued growth in numbers and quality of service. We hope to add a well trained and compassionate female counselor this year to widen our counseling opportunities for clients. The library office continues to be a very warm, pleasant space to offer clients privacy and a comfortable setting. The digital church sign, noting our service, advertises well our church's comprehensive ministry.

The Samaritan's Fund at LifePoint continues to be able to subsidize counseling for those of limited resources. We thank you for supporting our annual art auction to raise money. This year's auction will be held in late March in Columbia. We hope you will come. Many of our clients need help in the most urgent and poignant way, and they cannot afford the counseling fee. This truly is a compassionate and powerful effort.

Heartfelt appreciation is expressed to Pastor Stoxen and all of you at Living Springs for your hospitality, vision, care for others, and compassion in offering your building and program to house this ministry. LIVING SPRINGS PRESCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT 2010

We have had another wonderful year here at LSLCPS/ASC. We continue to work in partnership with the church and congregation to help strengthen our commitment to serving this community and spreading the ministry of Living Springs.

Here are a few highlights from 2010:

- As usual we started off the year right, with **brainstorming** ways that we can continue our work in this community and strengthen our commitment to being a team and working together for our shared vision.
- During **Lutheran Schools Week** in March, we celebrated many exciting activities with the children and parents, including special treats shared with families. Such as: special visits in the classrooms, sharing stories and books, sharing art activities and games. Our week was kicked off with a special Sunday service to say “Thank You” to our teachers for all that they do. The congregation and fellow ministry teams also treated to the teachers to a wonderful luncheon to show their appreciation. It was quite a treat!
- Last year we made a move to **going more “Green”**. We purchased bowls and spoons for the children to use at snack and lunch times. We had been using paper and plastic products in the past. This was both costly as well as not as environmentally responsible as we could be. We feel that this is still an area of growth, as we look at more ways to use washable/recyclable products. Since our decision to move forward with this concept last year, we have seen a savings in our product cost. We have also installed soap dispensers at each sink in the classrooms. This has allowed us to move away from the commercial “bagged soap” to gallon size bottles which we use to refill the dispensers. We have also added dispensers in the adult bathrooms and classroom bathrooms as well. This has increased our savings making us both more fiscally responsible as well as modeling to our children how to save and be environmentally friendly.
- Another **cost savings measure** we have included this year is moving away from our commercial paper towel distributor to using an “in house” employee to go to the local “super store” to purchase paper towels. We have added paper towel dispensers to all necessary areas and no longer use the commercial company. This expense had been quite large in the past, we were able to increase our savings in this area to better utilize those funds elsewhere.
- We celebrated **NAEYC’s Week of the Young Child** with our Annual Field Day in April. As we did last year, we sold reusable water bottles with our LSLCPS/ASC logo along with popcorn at field day. We had several church members join us to help with the sales, and the festivities. We had a strong community outreach and participation. It was a fun way to work together with church members and the community, to get the word out about the great things

that we have to offer here at LSLCPS. We look forward to an even larger event next year!

- We held our **4yr. old promotion** in May for both our full and half day children. As always that is a bittersweet time of year as we watch those that have grown so much over the years, leave us to go on to kindergarten. Fortunately we do get to see many of the children when they come back to our ASC program. This year we had many younger siblings “promoted” so that was nice to see those continuing families that have a history with LSLCPS.
- We had another exciting **Summer Camp** this year. This was the second year that the Preschool and Church Summer Camp have “officially” shared this activity. The children really enjoyed the music portion and it was yet another way for us to share with the children and families the power of what we do here. One thing that did change this year was the addition of bringing the “Summer Camp” downstairs. Our first year we involved our summer campers that are school aged, this year we involved ages 2-4 into the program. How EXCITING!! ALL ages enjoyed the daily live music (from toddlers to 5th graders). We had a gracious donation from our congregational members The Tracy’s. They made the summer camp T-shirts for staff and children to wear during the week. We were able to utilize the classrooms downstairs to use as different activity rooms. The children were then able to transition from room to room and follow the schedule of activities. This was such rejuvenation for staff and children. It really showed how well we can work together to make great things happen!
- The **Fall Festival** in October was a great success! It was also our 3rd annual Trunk-or-Treat. It was a wonderful outreach to the community. Thankfully we weren’t rained out this year. The weather was actually quite nice. We estimated that we had approx. 200 people at the event. We cooked two 18 qt. roasters of chili along with another 8 qt. pot and we almost ran out! Thanks to Tina Edwards and her daughter Taylor we had enough cornbread. They made cornbread all morning long! We also held our Silent Auction the same evening; we made approx. \$1000.00 with this as well as the donations from the chili dinner. We certainly will need volunteers to prepare for the upcoming 2011 celebration, so please keep us in mind!
- We also held our **Annual Cobb Cookie Fundraiser** this fall; we were able to put approx. \$1100.00 into our fund to use for various things this year, such as: Staff incentives, classroom activities and supplies. This is a wonderful company that we have worked with for several years. They are committed to customer service and are a local business. It is always nice to be able to support our “neighbors”.
