A Time to Remember

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

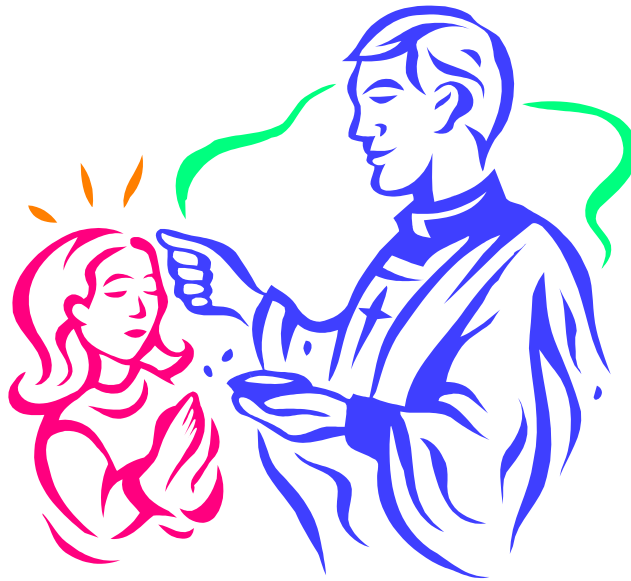
We begin our Lenten journey with these words “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.” On Ash Wednesday a sign of the cross is made on our foreheads with ashes from the Palms from the previous Palm Sunday. These ashes are both a sign and they are an invitation.

Ashes have long been a symbol of grief, mourning, and our mortality. “When Job loses everything, he sits among the ashes. Cursed and overrun by enemies, the Psalmist ‘eats ashes like bread, and mingles tears with drink.’ Ashes are what are left after destruction. After chaos or catastrophe, ashes are what remain.” Who among us can forget the picture of ashes drifting through the New York City skies when the Twin Towers fell?

“Ashes also remind us of a common origin.” When we hear the words, “Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return,” we are reminded of our common bond of humanity. The ashes remind us of our common beginning – of our creation – of our oldest stories of faith. They remind us of a loving God, stooping in the dust and the clay, forming human kind and giving us life through breath.

The ashes tell us that at our deepest level we are one – that we share a common bond of our humanness and a common bond of God's love. The ashes are a reminder of our common bond in creation and our common home in God. They are a promise of our eternal life in God.

While ashes may signify and remind, they also invite. They invite us to repentance. They invite us to turn again to God and receive new life. Ashes are not just “the end but are the beginning.” They are an invitation to remember that we do live in a world where there is hurt, pain and brokenness. They are a reminder that we cannot learn to forgive until we learn to acknowledge that we, ourselves, need to be forgiven – that as good as we may be – as loving and caring as we may be – as hopeful and full of promise as we may be – we still stand in need, from time-to-time, of forgiveness.



These ashes that we will have placed on our foreheads on **Wednesday March 9 at 7:00 PM** are an invitation to a Holy Lent to the journey that ends at the empty cross at Easter.

1. Look at the flower chart in the back of the church and put your name down for the date you would like.

3. Then either order the flowers from pampered plants – 788-0318 and they will deliver them on Saturday to the church. A second choice is for you to make your own arrangement or purchase the arrangement from somewhere else and you can bring them to church before Saturday's 5:05 worship.
4. After the 10:45 service, you can take the flowers home with you or you can leave them for the church staff and they will divide them up into small vases and bring them to our shut ins.

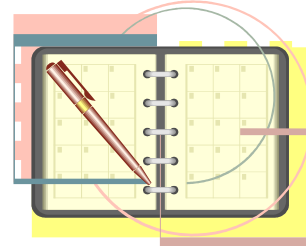

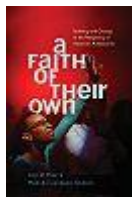

There is a new book out that I thought might interest some of our parents. It is called [A Faith of Their Own: Stability and Change in the Religiosity of America's Adolescents](#) by Lisa Pearce and Melinda Lundquist Denton. Drawing on the massive National Study of Youth and Religion's telephone surveys and in-depth interviews with more than 120 youth at two points in time, the authors chart the spiritual trajectory of American adolescents and young adults over a period of three years. In it the author relies on data collected from young people age 13-23 and states, "The most important predictor of the religious aspect of a young person's life is the PARENTS. Parents continue to matter. Peers still play a part, but peers don't outmatch the parents when it comes to the religious trajectory of a youth's life." This book is available through Amazon, Barnes and Noble and Books a Million.
