A Time to Remember

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We continue our journey through Lent, 40 days, a solemn preparation before the joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection. Coming to Lent means coming to life. The weeks in Lent mark the drift of the green across the landscape. Daylight is growing: the sun is reasserting itself.

We move from Ashen Cross on our foreheads on Ash Wednesday to the new fire on Easter morning. As we walk through Lent we remember where we have been, where we are going and it invites us to the question of what then shall we do now? The disciplines of Lent are the tools for transformation. Each is important part of who we are spiritually.

The Lenten Fast: it is a matter of keeping life in balance. Overconsumption is as bad for the soul as it is for the waist line. We need to determine what is essential, let go of empty baggage, and focus on one or two chief tasks that deserve our greatest effort – here and now.

Life of Prayer: A world cut off from God can never hope to be a place of life. Lent is a time for us to have a deep heart-to-heart with the creator who made us, the redeemer who claims us, the sanctifier who brings us to renewal. Lent is a time for listening and speaking, for entertaining the cycle of communication that will lead to life.

Acts of Kindness: The dialogue with God naturally leads to connection with those around us. During Lent we ask more seriously; why are we doing it? For whom are we Christians? Although Lent invites a deeper inward discipline, it also moves us beyond ourselves and toward others. Following the lead of Jesus, we are to be for others in a way that is transforming not only for us, but for those about whom we are concerned.

Over the next few weeks there will be much to notice in worship. All the elements of our Gospel readings will unfold into our Holy week observances. These are the deepest of our faith. We can't get to the empty tomb, without the death on the cross.

Come for Holy Week Services; come experience the shadow of the cross and the empty tomb and the resurrection promise on Easter morning.

FROM BISHOP HERMAN YOOS

This morning I read Romans 8:22:

“We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now,” and I thought about all the pictures of suffering and loss that we have seen in Japan these past few days. I know that you and your congregations have already been praying for God’s comfort and strength to be with all of our sisters and brothers in Japan who have experienced this triple tragedy of earthquake, tsunami, and some nuclear radiation emissions.

In addition to your prayers, you are also encouraged to send any special relief offerings from your congregation to the synod office marked for “Japan Evangelical Lutheran Church” or “JELC.”

Yesterday we heard from Pastor Sumiyuki Wantanabe, President of the JELC, that they are organizing volunteers to go into areas that have been the hardest hit. They would greatly welcome our financial support being distributed through their network of relief and assistance where it is needed most. He also shared with us that both Lutheran churches in the city of Sendai are OK and one even has full use of its utilities for which we are grateful.

Our relationship with Lutherans in Japan began in the late 1800’s. The first Lutheran missionary to Japan was ordained and commissioned at St. John’s in Charleston by the United Synod of the South. We have been blessed ever since those days with a deep mutual relationship between the South Carolina Synod and the JELC. Currently the JELC has grown to having 23,000 baptized members, 119 churches and 97 clergy.

Thank you for the outpouring of prayer and support for all those who have suffered severe loss of loved ones and all that they possess. The last part of Romans 8 speaks to the courage and confidence that we claim together as followers of Jesus:

“In all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.”

SPRING FLING DINNER CLUB EVENT

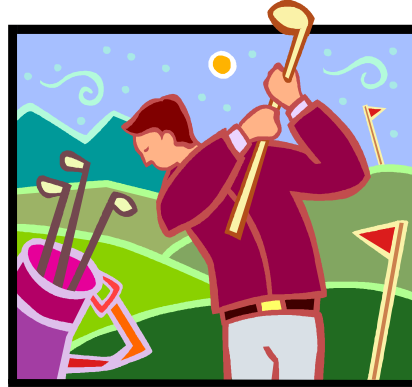

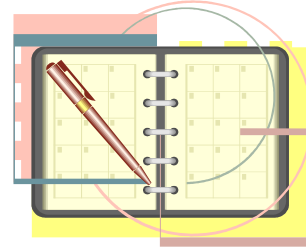
