Stewardship

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
We have had a wonderful month in the Big Group Adult Sunday School Class. We have been talking about stewardship, all kinds of Stewardship. As each teacher examined their area of stewardship, they have all given us a challenge.

1. Mike Davidson taught on Environmental Stewardship, and challenged us to reduce our consumption of world goods by 10%, a tithe. This meant changing your thermostat to save electricity, walking or carpooling instead of driving your own car, saving water, recycling, etc. Reducing your environmental foot print.
2. Mark Stuart talked about our talents. He challenged us to try new things. Look at what we are doing, and what gifts we have to contribute to the life the of the church and the world. He has experienced, the more you give, the more you get out of it. He also challenged us to develop our gifts and talents.
3. Kathryn Padgett spoke about our time as God's time, and the way we spend our time should be God centered.
4. Todd Gunvalson spoke about financial stewardship and that we are stewards, not owners of the gifts that God has entrusted to us.

Finally I spoke about the Seven Biblical Principles of Stewardship

I. GOD'S STEWARDS ARE GOD'S STEWARDS.

God's stewards are stewards by virtue of creation and their re-creation in Holy Baptism; therefore, they belong to the Lord.

II. GOD'S STEWARDS ARE MANAGERS, NOT OWNERS.

God's stewards have been entrusted by God with life and life's resources and given the privilege of responsibly and joyfully managing them for Him.

III. GOD'S STEWARDS ARE SAINTS AND SINNERS.

God's stewards rejoice in and live out what God has declared them to be through the

cross. At the same time His stewards recognize they are sinners who fight sin and its consequences each day.

IV. GOD'S STEWARDS ARE UNIQUELY SINGULAR, YET PROFOUNDLY PLURAL.

God's stewards recognize that their lives are not solo performances but are personal responses to God, lived out within the community of faith to benefit the whole world.

V. GOD'S STEWARDS ARE *IN* THE WORLD, BUT NOT *OF* THE WORLD.

God's stewards recognize that the Lord sets them apart from the world and by the transforming power of the Gospel sends them into the world to live out the Gospel.

VI. GOD'S STEWARDS ARE LOVED AND LOVING.

God's stewards recognize that their stewardship flows out of God's act of love for them in Christ which empowers them, in turn, to love others in acts of Christ-like love.

VII. GOD'S STEWARDS ARE SERVED AND SERVING.

God's stewards recognize that their stewardship involves a Gospel-powered style of life which is demonstrated in servanthood within all the arenas of life.

VIII. GOD'S STEWARDS LIVE WITH AN AWARENESS OF THE PRESENT AND FUTURE, OF TIME AND ETERNITY.

God's stewards live intentionally in the light of God's eternal purpose while being firmly committed to His rule in the here and now.

On the weekend of October 16 and 17 you will be given the opportunity to share the gifts that God has entrusted to you. You will have an opportunity to share your fishes and loaves. I pray you take some time over the next few weeks to discern what God is calling you to do with your time, talent and treasure. How can you give back, what God has first given you?

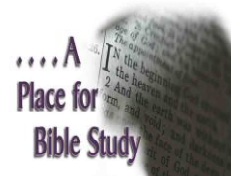

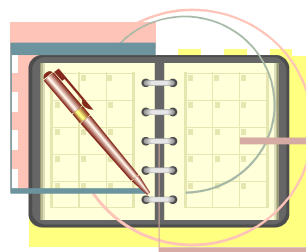

God and Family –Passing on Faith Milestone for our 4th-5th graders!!

As the Team Ministry Chair of the Passing of Faith milestone, I have been asked about adding a new milestone called P.R.A.Y. which stands for Programs of Religious Activities with Youth. It is a program whereby boys and girls can earn their Lutheran Emblem for cub scouts, boy scouts and girl scouts. Since my son is in cub scouts, I decided to look into it. What I found was a program whose Vision Statement is “Young people are brought closer to Christ through dynamic programs that enable adults in their ministry with youth. Our programs and resources are offered through churches and youth agencies for them to work together for the benefit of youth”. I immediately realized this was a program that fit perfectly with our Passing on Faith Ministry! AND, it is not just for scouts but for all boys and girls and families here at LSLC!

After some discussion the Passing on Faith team decided to concentrate on grades 4-5. The curriculum goals for the God and Family program are:

- To provide an opportunity for young people and families to explore their faith together
- To learn six ways of strengthening families through faith
- To help families grow in God's love
- To memorize the Ten Commandments

The God and Family Milestone is open to ALL 4th and 5th grade students and a special adult in their life. The Passing on Faith team has decided to also use this as an outreach opportunity by inviting Webelo scouts and Girl Scouts in the area that may not have a home church or have a church that gives them the chance to earn this religious emblem.
