Gift of Time

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Children are back in school (and maybe adults too!), sports seasons are back in full swing and our schedules are getting full again after a much needed break over the summer.

It is a good opportunity to think about the gift of time that God has given us and how we can best use our time in the midst of demanding priorities and schedules.

In the book of James we hear, *“What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? ...I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works.” James 2:14, 18.*

One way we demonstrate our faith and our witness to others is how we spend our time, talent and treasure. How do we share our faith by the time we spend with God, by the talents we share in ministry and by the treasure we give to support the work of the Church?



I encourage you to look at your time and prioritize how you spend your time. As Americans we are too busy and we work too much, primarily because we want too much stuff. We are so busy working and acquiring stuff we often have no time:

- For taking care of our health, eating right and exercising.
- For building strong family relationships, marriages and friendships.
- For volunteering in our communities.
- For recycling and caring for our environment.
- For educating ourselves about the political issues of the time.
- For deepening our spiritual lives and our relationship with God.

I encourage you to use your time intentionally; it is God's gift to you. Be a good steward of your time; be intentional on how you spend it. Time is one of the most valuable things we are given.

I encourage you to think about the following

- Do I spend at least one hour a week with God by attending Worship Service?
- What are other ways I can give time back to God? Prayer? Helping people who are in need? Reading the Bible?
- Compared to the time I give to friends, sports, TV, the Internet, etc., how much time do I give to God each week?

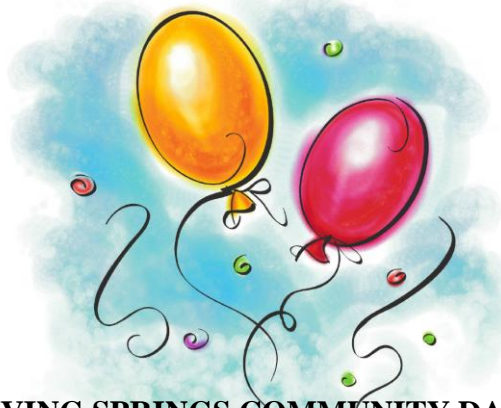

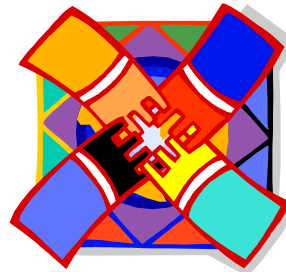

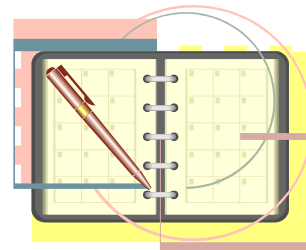

Passing on the Faith Milestones

Our *Passing on the Faith Milestone Ministry Team* focuses upon offering a number of practical resources "to equip families to pass on faith and live well in Jesus Christ." The dates for our 2011-12 Faith Milestone Celebrations are below, but first, read the words shared by a milestone recipient: 5th grader, Corin Wiggins:

Four Classes of Faith

I was five years old when my mom and I took the 1st Communion Class, so honestly, I don't remember much about the class but I was able to pull out the chalice I made, the placemat I decorated, the certificate and Bible I received from my faith chest. What the 1st Communion Class taught me was what Communion means and it gave me permission to take Communion in church. This class was important to me because it helped me understand why we are taking Communion.

When I was in 2nd grade my mom and I took the Kids & Money Class. My Kids & Money booklet was also in my faith chest. My mom and I used the booklet through the class to learn how to use money God's way. I made three jars, one says Giving, one says Saving and one says Spending. Every time I get money, I give 10% to the Giving jar. The money in the Giving jar is the money that I take to Sunday School to put in the Offering Can. I have also used this money for the Backpack program and God's Storehouse. This class was important to me because it helped me learn how God wants me to use money.

When I was in 3rd grade my mom and I took The Lord's Prayer Class. My Lord's Prayer bookmark was also in my faith chest. I learned what each part of the Lord's Prayer means and what some of the fancy words in the prayer mean. I also learned how to pray and that the Lord's Prayer is a model that can be followed. The teachers gave me a jar to put in my prayers to Jesus. They also gave me a laminated paper that says TRIP on it. TRIP helps me remember how to pray to Jesus; T stands for Thanks, R stands for Regrets, I stands for Intercessions, and P is for Purpose. The class was important to me because it helped me learn the Lord's Prayer and different ways to pray.

When I was in 4th grade my mom and I took the God and Family Class. The Faith Emblem that I received as a gift is not in my faith chest because I wear it proudly on my Cub Scout uniform. I learned a lot of stuff in this class. One thing I learned is that we are all part of God's family. Another thing I learned is that in God's family we are loved no

matter what. I learned other things and the way we showed all this was making a pizza. Each day we would add something to the pizza, each one like cheese or sauce represented what we learned that day. The class was important to me because it not only allowed me to earn my Cub Scout Religious Emblem but also helped me learn many other things about God's Family.

All of these classes were really fun and helped me learn valuable things about God, Jesus and my faith. I completely recommend giving these classes and future classes a try.

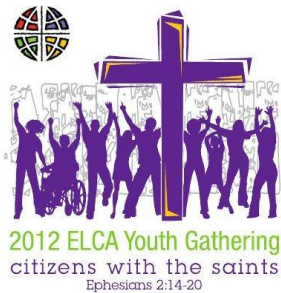
